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Workplan of Trade logistics policy 2079 Working Definition

- 1) **3PL:** Third-Party Logistics- Third-party logistics companies offer logistics services and support some or all aspects of a business's shipping operations, managing all aspects of moving goods from manufacturers and distributors to the end customer. A 3PL is commonly used in outsourced logistics and supply-chain management to outsource a company's shipping and fulfilment services, which can include:
 - Transportation
 - Warehousing
 - Materials procurement
 - Inventory management
 - Customs brokerage
 - Freight audit
 - Payment
 - Shipment tracking

For these reasons, a 3PL is usually integrated within a company's warehouse management and transportation operations for a comprehensive delivery workflow.

- 2) **4PL:** Fourth-Party Logistics- Fourth Party Logistics, known as 4PL in the industry, is a model of logistics where manufacturers outsource all of the organization and oversight of their supply chain and logistics to one external provider.
- 3) **5PL:** Fifth-Party Logistics: Fifth-party logistics (5PL) has emerged to help e-commerce businesses manage increasing supply chain pressures. But what exactly does it cover, and is it the right fit for your business? Read on as we examine the various supply chain management options available to help your e-commerce business meet demand and ensure your customer promises are kept. A 5PL will plan, organize and implement a client's logistics solutions, taking all elements of supply chain management out of their hands. Their focus on supply networks means they'll oversee every single supply chain within an organization
- 4) Blended Financing: Blended finance is the strategic use of development finance for the mobilization of additional finance towards sustainable development in developing countries. Blended financing contains financing through a concessional window, commercial window and finance from public and philanthropic funders. Blended finance support to attract commercial capital towards projects that contribute to sustainable development while providing financial returns to investors.

5) Cross-border logistics is a whole section of knowledge based on transport connections between countries around the globe. It's a type of network helping with supply chain management and efficient flow of products in compliance with international legal and tax regulations.

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- 6) **E-commerce:** E-commerce or electronic commerce is the trading of goods and services on the internet. It is your bustling city centre or brick-and-mortar shop translated into zeroes and ones on the internet superhighway.
- 7) **Gender Equity and Social Inclusion**: Gender Equality and Social Inclusion (GESI) is a concept that addresses improving access to livelihood assets and services for ALL, including the women, poor, and excluded. It supports more inclusive policies and mindsets and increases the voice and influence of all including of women, the poor and excluded.
- 8) Logistics e-marketplace: marketplace for logistics management is a platform where a large number of transport and distribution companies (couriers) are integrated, with the possibility of having their services
- 9) **Multifunctional Trade infrastructure:** MTI is the infrastructure that provides multiple services related to the smooth operation of trade. It connects the services provided by multiple agencies using the same infrastructure. It provides the opportunity to use the infrastructure for multiple uses.
- 10) **Multimodal logistics park**: MLP is officially defined as a freight-handling facility with a minimum area of 100 acres (40.5 hectares), with various modes of transport access, mechanized warehouses, specialized storage solutions such as cold storage, facilities for mechanized material handling and inter-modal transfer container terminals.
- 11) **Non-transport Infrastructure**: Infrastructures related to trade other than transportation systems like financial services, customs, warehouses, and quarantine services. The services from the government, private and the involvement of both.
- 12) **Resilient Supply Chain:** Supply chain resilience refers to the ability of a given supply chain to prepare for and adapt to unexpected events; to quickly adjust to sudden disruptive changes that negatively affect supply chain performance; to continue functioning during a disruption (sometimes referred to as "robustness"); and to recover quickly
 - This partner will be responsible for all of the supply chain management, for assessing, designing, building, running, and measuring solutions for the client. - 13) **Trade Infrastructure**: Infrastructure is defined as the basic physical systems of a business, region, or nation and often involves the production and distribution of public goods or production processes. Examples of infrastructure include transportation systems, communication networks, financial services, warehouses, quarantine and other traderelated infrastructures.
- 14) **Trade Logistics**: Trade logistics refers to the management process that includes the entire flow of goods and information between suppliers and companies and between customers and companies. Trade logistics also includes the internal flow of goods.
- 15) **Transport Infrastructure**: Transport infrastructure refers to the framework that supports our transport system. This includes roads, railways, ports and airports. National and local governments are responsible for the development of our transport

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
