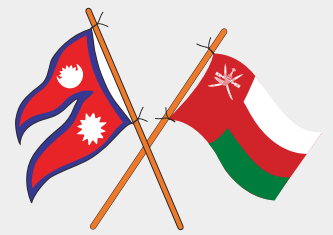
Halal tourism implies tourism activities that cater to the visitors who are particular about tourism based on the principles of Shariah, the cornerstone of Islamic beliefs.

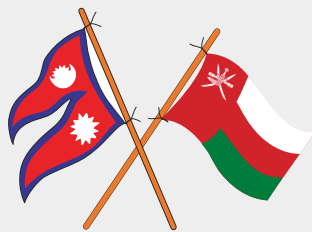

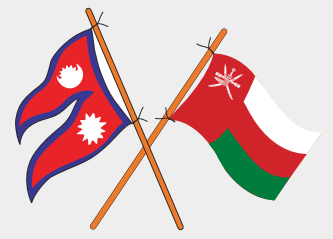
