## PART I: BACKGROUND

### 1.1 Introduction of the UGC

The University Grants Commission (UGC); a statutory organization established under the act approved by the parliament on November 22, 1993 (Mangsir 7, 2050 BS), is mainly responsible for the allocation and disbursement of the grants to universities and their campuses, regulating their activities, formulating policies and programs. Also, the UGC coordinates with the government and other stakeholders for the establishment of the new universities in the country.

The overarching goal of the UGC is coordinating and strengthening the higher education in the country and create a sound environment to the higher education system in Nepal.

### 1.2 Functions of the UGC

- Formulate policies on the allocation of the government grants to universities and higher education institutions.
- Disburse grants to the universities and make recommendations to the government for the grants provision.
- Award research grants, scholarships, and fellowships.

- Take necessary measures to determine and maintain the criteria and standards of higher education.
- Formulate necessary policies and programs to promote and enhance the quality of higher education.
- Advise the Government of Nepal on the establishment of new universities.
- Make arrangements necessary for the exchange of facilities and fellowship between universities and educational institutions within and outside Nepal.

### 1.3 Composition of the UGC

According to Article 5 of the UGC Act, the UGC consists of eleven members, all appointed by the Government of Nepal. The Chairman and the Member-Secretary are the only fulltime office bearers. The nine members include two Secretaries of the Ministries of Education and Finance, a member of the National Planning Commission, two vice-chancellors, two prominent educationists, and two distinguished professors. ## PART II : UNIVERSITIES AND INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION

### 2.1 Universities and Academies of Nepal

The history of higher education started in Nepal by the establishment of the first college i.e. Tri-Chandra College in 1918. Tribhuvan University came into existence in 1959 and it was the only university in Nepal until 1985. In the early 80's, the Government developed the concept for multi-university system and as a result, Mahendra Sanskrit University was established in 1986, followed by Kathmandu University in 1991, Purbanchal University in 1994, Pokhara University in 1997 and Lumbini Buddha University in 2005. All of these universities were established through the Acts approved by the Parliament and they function as public institutions.

B. P. Koirala Institute of Health Sciences is the first Health and Medical Academy of Nepal, established in 1994 and it was upgraded as a deemed university in 1999. Similarly, two other academies: National Academy of Medical Sciences (NAMS) and Patan Academy of Health Sciences (PAHS) were established in 2002 and 2009 respectively.

Recently, the Nepal government has established three more universities viz. Mid-western University, Far-western University, and Agriculture and Forestry University.

#### 2.1.1 Tribhuvan University (TU)

Tribhuvan University (TU), established in 1959 (2016 BS) is the largest university of Nepal in terms of the courses it offers and the number of students and teachers it has. Its central office is located in Kirtipur, Kathmandu and it conducts its operations across the country through five institutes, four faculties, and four research centers that are mentioned below.

#### Institutes:

- Institute of Agriculture and Animal Sciences (IAAS)
- Institute of Medicine (IoM)
- Institute of Engineering (IoE)
- Institute of Forestry (IoF)
- Institute of Science and Technology (IoST)

#### Faculties:

- Faculty of Education
- Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences
- Faculty of Management
- Faculty of Law

### Research Centers:

- Centre for Economic Development and Administration (CEDA)
- Research Centre for Educational Innovation and Development (CERID)
- Centre for Nepal and Asian Studies (CNAS)
- Research Centre for Applied Science and Technology (RECAST)

The institutes are technical i.e. they offer specialized education on technical courses such as, management, humanities, education, engineering, medicine, law, and arts at the Bachelor, Master, M. Phil., and Ph.D. levels. Among the universities of Nepal, it claims more than 87% percent of the total enrolment in higher education. Now, The university has 374,706 students in 792 campuses (60 constituent, 732 affiliated campuses), with 13,259 teachers and 7,122 administrative and support staff.

#### 2.1.2 Nepal Sanskrit University (NSU)

Established in 1986 (2043 BS) NSU aims to modernize the education of Sanskrit in the country. It is located in Beljhundi, Dang and has 3,624 students with 419 teachers and 376 administrative staff in 21 campuses (12 constituent and 9 affiliated). It offers courses on Uttarmadhyama (Sanskrit), Shastree (Sanskrit), Kabiraj (Intermediate in Ayurved), Bachelor in Ayurved, Acharya (Sanskrit), Ph.D. (Sanskrit), Language Training, and Yoga Training related to Sanskrit.

#### 2.1.3 Kathmandu University (KU)

Established in 1991, Kathmandu University (KU) is located in Dhulikhel, a tourist destination, of Kavre district. Currently, it has 9,282 students, 341 teachers, 82 visiting faculties with 181 administrative and support staff in 21 campuses (6 constituent, 15 affiliated). The university offers 106 programs in the field of science, engineering, management, fine arts, education and medicines from intermediate to M.Phil. and Ph.D. levels.

#### 2.1.4 Purbanchal University (PU)

Established in 1994, Purbanchal University (PU) is located in Biratnagar, the second largest city in Nepal. Purbanchal University has 18,490 students, 49 teachers, and 296 administrative and support staff in 95 campuses (3 constituent, 92 affiliated). The university offers 56 programs with courses on science, law, engineering, management, fine arts, education, etc.

#### 2.1.5 Pokhara University (PokU)

Pokhara University (PokU) was established in 1997 in Pokhara, the most popular tourist destination of the country which lies in Kaski district. The university has 13,171 students, 50 teachers, 177 administrative and technical staff and 50 campuses (4 constituent, 46 affiliated) offering 41 programs and courses on humanities, management, science and technology, engineering, medicines etc.

#### 2.1.6 Lumbini Buddha University (LBU)

Lumbini Buddha University, established in 2005, is located in Lumbini, the birthplace of Gautam Buddha, of Rupandehi district. The university is established primarily to teach/study the philosophies promulgated by Gautam Buddha. It is in its starting phase and students are yet to be enrolled.

#### 2.1.7 Mid-western, Far-western, and Agriculture and Forestry Universities

The Government of Nepal has recently announced the establishment of the above mentioned universities. The UGC and other stakeholders are currently in the process of carrying out the initial work related to the establishment of these universities.

#### 2.1.8 B.P. Koirala Institute of Health Sciences (BPKIHS)

Established in 1993, BPKIHS is located in Dharan (Sunsari district) with a focus on providing education in the medical sciences. Its single campus has 1,192 students and 183 teachers offering 11 programs in medical sciences including M.D./M.S.,

M.Sc., M.P.H., M.L.T., M.B.B.S., B.Sc., B.D.S., Nursing, etc. (See Annex P for a detailed information on BPKIHS.)

### 2.1.9 National Academy of Medical Sciences (NAMS)

NAMS was established in 2002 in Kathmandu to provide education in medical sciences. The campus has 203 students and 142 teachers offering 14 programs in medical sciences at M.D. level in Anesthesiology, Dermatology, Neurosurgery, General Surgery etc.

### 2.1.10 Patan Academy of Health Sciences (PAHS)

Established in 2009, PAHS is located in Patan of Lalitpur district. It is based at Patan Hospital, which is likely to become a major teaching hospital for the academy. The academy is planning on starting a School of Nursing, and School of Applied Health Sciences. Its single campus has 60 students and 85 teachers.

## 4.1 Refresher Training/Training Program

The main objective of this program is to bring into discussion the changes in courses and teaching methodologies among the teachers. It also helps the teachers build their capacity by acquainting themselves with the latest information technology and tools used in teaching. Under this program, the following activities were undertaken:

### 4.1.1 Refresher Training

The objective of the training was to help keep the university teachers updated on the changes in course contents and teaching methodologies. The refresher trainings were conducted by universities, subject committees, Dean's Offices, Departments, Campuses or other higher education institutions. In order to get this support, the host organization had to submit a grant proposal to the UGC office and the programs that met the specified criteria were selected. The proposal should be prepared based on the following guidelines:

- The proposal for refresher training and workshop can be prepared and submitted by a university, a campus, a department, or a subject committee.
- The proposal should include recommendation of the Dean, Department Chief or Campus Chief.
- The timeframe for the refresher training should in general, be of up to three weeks.
- The subject matter of the program should be related to the curriculum of Bachelor's or Master's level.
- The related subject teachers of the constituent and affiliated campuses of the universities can participate in the program.
- The accepted grants can be used for the following purposes:
  - Development of educational materials for training/workshop
  - Remuneration for the expert
  - Report preparation
  - Other necessary expenditures.
- The grant amount will be decided by the Commission.

#### 4.1.2 Training Program

Under this program, different trainings can be conducted to develop the capacity of the teachers and staff as proposed by the University, Subject Committee, Dean Office, Department, Campus or other related body. Proposals for the Training Program should meet the following criteria:

- The proposal should include recommendation from the University, Dean, Central Department Chief or the Campus Chief concerned.
- Subject teachers and staff of the University or constituent and affiliated campuses can participate in the program.
- The accepted grants can be used for the following purpose:
  - Educational materials for training
  - Remuneration for experts
  - Report preparation
  - Other necessary expenditures
- The grant amount will be as decided by the Commission.

#### 4.2 Fellowship Program

Fellowships are provided every year to teachers of universities and their affiliated and constituent campuses to strength their academic capabilities.

##### 4.2.1 Ph.D. Study

Ph.D. fellowship is provided for teachers to enhance the quality of higher education through capacity building. To be considered for the Ph. D. fellowship, permanent teachers from universities/affiliated campuses can apply by submitting an application along with the recommendation of the educational organization with which they are affiliated. The application and award process for Ph.D. is as follows:

##### Application process:

- The candidates should fill out the standard application form of the Commission and submit it within the deadline. Incomplete and late applications are not entertained.
- The application fee of Rs 100 can be paid to the Financial Administration Division of the Commission or sent through a bank draft payable to the Commission through Rastriya Banijya Bank, Sanothimi branch.

- For Ph.D. study fellowship, the age of the applicant should not exceed 50 years by the application deadline (for women, Dalits and Janajatis the age limit is 52 years).
- Fellowship is provided for Ph.D. study only within Nepal or SAARC countries.
- Teachers that have not yet enrolled for a Ph.D. program can still apply. If they are selected for the fellowship they should begin the study within one year of nomination.
- Candidates must submit a study leave approval letter from the University /Campus concerned.
- An interview will be conducted. The merit list of candidates will be published based on their academic performance, publications, subject matter of the study proposal, knowledge of the subject matter, presentation, quota and quality of the research proposal.
- The number of fellowships will be determined in accordance with the availability of the budget.
- The following fellowships will be provided:
  - ✓ Fellowships of Rs 4,500 per month.
  - ✓ A maximum of Rs 10,000 for field study on the recommendation of the supervisor. For this purpose, the candidate should present a detailed plan. Half of the amount will be provided in advance and the remaining amount will be provided after submission of the field report along with the recommendation from the supervisor.
  - ✓ Rs 8,000 for books and reference materials in two installments.
  - ✓ Up to Rs 7,000 for laboratory expenditures for the candidates of the faculty of science and technology. The candidate should present the bills of the items procured and a proof of use of the items along with a recommendation from the supervisor.
  - ✓ Rs 10,000 for typing and binding after submission of the thesis.
  - ✓ Rs 10,000 as an incentive for the candidates submitting the thesis within three years after enrollment for the program.
- ✓ Monthly fellowships will be awarded in two installments per year. However, the fellowship for the last six months is to be provided only after the submission of the thesis.
- ✓ Scholars should submit progress reports in every six month along with the recommendation of the supervisor or the institution concerned. The UGC can withhold the installment if the candidate fails to submit their progress report.
- ✓ The progress of the fellows will be reviewed through the presentations organized at the UGC office. The Ph. D. fellows are required to present the progress report once a year. Payment is withheld in case of failure to present the progress report.
- ✓ Miscellaneous work related to the fellowship will be as decided by the Commission.
- ✓ Ph. D. fellows should sign an agreement detailing the terms and conditions of the fellowship.
- ✓ This fellowship is only for candidates who have not received support from any other sources. The academic committee can terminate the fellowship and recover the amount if the Commission is made aware of other sources of funding for the Ph. D. fellows.
- ✓ The Chief Supervisor of each Ph.D. fellow from any university in Nepal is provided with Rs 5,000 once the fellow submits their thesis.
- ✓ The fellowship recipient will have to submit a report with the appropriate reason in case of failure to submit the thesis within three years after registration for Ph.D. study. With a review of the report, the academic committee of the UGC can extend the deadline for a maximum of two years, one year each time, if the reason look satisfactory.

- ✓ The file of the scholars will be closed after five years and they will not get any support thereafter. The Scholarship term will be terminated after five years wherein the candidate may not reapply for the same thesis topic.

Sixty-six teachers had applied for the Ph.D. fellowship in the fiscal year 2009/10. The academic committee decided to provide full fellowship to 24 teachers.

#### 4.2.2 M. Phil. Study

A limited number of M. Phil. fellowships are provided every year to university or campus teachers pursuing M. Phil. study in their university or affiliated/constituent campuses. Fellows are selected through open competition. The number of fellowships depends on the availability of budget.

Under this program, a stipend of Rs 2,500 a month is provided to each fellow in two installments per year.

An additional Rs 5,000 is provided to the candidates once they submit a copy of their thesis and a letter of thesis submission to the department concerned. Academic qualifications, publications, and interview will be the basis of selection to this program.

A total of 91 candidates had applied for M. Phil. fellowship in the fiscal year 2009/10 and forty of them were selected for the support.

#### 4.2.3 Support for M. Phil. Thesis Preparation

A pre-defined number of teachers pursuing M.Phil. study in Nepali universities who have not received this fellowship or any other previous support are eligible for this finding. A maximum of two best theses selected by the central departments concerned will be awarded Rs 15,000 each. Each year, a maximum of two students from each central department will be awarded such support. The central departments of universities in Nepal will have to select the theses of the two best students

every year and submit them to the Commission for support.

#### 4.2.4 Support for Handicapped Student

Under this program, up to 15 handicapped students pursuing Master's degree in Nepal universities are provided upto Rs 20,000 each for thesis preparation every year through open competition. The application should include a letter from their respective departments testifying that the student has been registered for thesis, and photocopies of certificates of disability, Bachelor's

degree, and provisional marksheets of Master's degree. Half of the amount will be released in advance and the rest after submission of the thesis. The full amount is to be provided in a single

installment if the student submits the thesis during the selection period. The Commission has provided support to the following handicapped students for the year 2009/10.

### 4.3 Research Promotion

Research furthers academic knowledge and thus helps improve the quality of not only an individual but also an educational institution. In this effect, the UGC has promulgated research support program since its inception.

The following programs were carried out under this program in the year 2009/10:

#### 4.3.1 Mini Research Projects

The aim of mini research projects is to orient teachers towards research by providing financial support to academicians who are upto Associate Professor level without a Ph.D. degree for a period of six-months. If the research is not completed within six months, the candidates can apply for extensions with justification upto two times.

The procedures for the grants are:

- A notice calling for research proposals will be published. The proposals should be submitted within the deadline.
- The proposal should be submitted in the format prescribed by the UGC.
- The proposal should include recommendation from the concerned department or campus and an updated CV of the researcher.
- Selected candidates should sign an agreement within 45 days of the acceptance of the proposal.
- The researcher is provided with a maximum of Rs 30,000 including taxes.
- The researcher should complete the research and furnish three spiral-bound copies of the draft report of the research work within the deadline to the Commission.
- Incorporating the evaluations and suggestions received during presentation, the researcher should submit three corrected and final hard-

bound copies and a CD copy of the report to the Commission.

- The grant approved is to be provided in three equal installments. The first will be paid after acceptance of the proposal and submission of research plan, the second; after submission of the draft research reports, and the third; after submission of the final report.
- The draft and final reports must include an abstract of at least two pages.
- After submission of the draft report, Rs 5000 will be provided for supplementing the typing and binding costs.
- The best researchers completing the research within the set deadline are conferred special awards during the anniversary day of the Commission.

(See Annex C for the list of individuals who were awarded the mini research grants for the year 2009/10.)

#### 4.3.2 Special Research

Under this program, one or more teachers/experts are provided grants for research on defined topics. The academic committee invites applications for research on specific topics. Grants can also be provided for special research proposals received from educational institutions, departments, Dean Offices, and professors and associate professors with a Ph.D. degree.

#### 4.3.3 Research Materials

Grants can be provided to researchers for certain research journals, books, equipments, and educational materials needed in the course of the research. After completing the research, they should hand over the equipments acquired to their related department/campus. This support will not apply for those receiving a Ph.D. fellowship from the UGC.

#### 4.3.4 Miscellaneous Support

Under this program, teachers of constituent and affiliated campuses pursuing Ph.D. study without any support from any other sources are provided

with financial grants. This support can be applied towards field study, research materials, typing and binding and other works depending on the nature of the work. Candidates can apply for this support by submitting a recommendation of the campus chief or supervisor along with a proposal/progress report. Every year, limited funding is available which is provided to candidates for one activity every six month. The support for typing and binding will be available after submission of the thesis. Candidates who have crossed five years of Ph.D. registration are not eligible for this support. For support towards field study; candidates should furnish the supervisor's recommendation as well as a detailed plan. For books; candidates must submit the associated bills.

### 4.4 Teaching/Study Visits

#### 4.4.1 Senior Professors' Visits to the Campuses

Under this program, subject teachers are provided grants for short-term teaching visits to constituent/affiliated campuses of universities in order to improve teaching-learning activities and provide assessments to improve teaching standards.

The following processes should be followed:

- The teacher has to be a professor or senior associate professor having expertise and experience on the subject.
- The UGC or the campus concerned will select the teacher and the program should be conducted by the campus itself.
- The campus concerned should submit the details about the subject, time period, and the service expected from the expert to the UGC.
- If the proposal is accepted, necessary expenditures needed for up to two teachers

per college can be provided. The amount provided can be used to cover the daily allowance, travel allowance, and remuneration of the teachers concerned.

- The remuneration will be paid after the teacher submits the details of the activities certified by the campus to the UGC.

#### 4.4.2 Visit to Institutions of the SAARC Countries for Special Study/Research

Under this program, financial support is offered to university/affiliated campus teachers to participate in short-term special study or research within the SAARC countries.

The following processes should be followed:

- With justifications and recommendations of the department concerned, application can be made to travel grants to any university or educational institution within SAARC for special study or research.
- Under this program, UGC will pay partial costs of the teacher's travel, accommodation, and living costs during their stay in the institution.
- Candidates should submit the acceptance letter from the host institution along with the application.
- This support is not provided to those already receiving fellowship from the UGC or any other organization.
- The amount of support will be decided on by the academic committee of the UGC.

#### 4.4.3 Travel Grants for Participation in Seminars/Conferences

Under this program, partial financial support is offered to teachers invited by international institutions to participate in conferences,

workshops, and seminars to present working papers or posters. The support can include travel costs, living costs, and in special circumstances, registration charges.

The following documents need to be furnished to seek travel grants:

- Letter of Invitation from the host institution.
- Recommendation letter from the head of the applicant's educational institution.
- A letter from the host organization clarifying the availability or non-availability of the financial or other support.
- A ticket or letter from the official sales agent or travel agency with the tariff.
- Acceptance letter from organizers about the presentation of the working paper/poster of the applicant and a brief summary of the working paper and poster.

The academician concerned must present a report with a program description to the Commission within one month after returning from the visit. Although the Commission can approve the travel grant before the travel, the amount is reimbursed after submission of the necessary documents to the Commission upon completion of the travel. While providing travel grants, priority will be given to teachers who have not received support from the UGC in the past. This grant will be provided only once per year. In the case that a group of teachers/writers are going abroad to present their paper; the support is provided only to the group leader. (The details on travel grants received by teachers are presented in Annex E.)

## 4.5 Seminars/Workshops/Conferences

Under this program, partial financial support is provided to academic societies of universities, campuses, departments, and related agencies to host seminar, workshop, and conference to study and analyze contemporary issues and problems in a specific area. The societies should organize such events jointly with the campus or the department concerned.

The following procedure should be followed:

- The institution should submit a proposal with the details on the theme, nature, time period, and venue of program along with the estimated costs, topics of the working papers, lists of writers and detailed schedule.
- The teachers' whose subject is related with the theme of the program, will be the participants of the program to the extent possible.

## 4.6 Grants for Strengthening Library and Equipment

Under this program, community campuses are provided with the following supports:

### 4.6.1 Grants for Purchasing Books

Under this Program, the UGC provides grants to community campuses to purchase books for their libraries. The process for receiving this grant is as follows:

- Campuses should submit a proposal seeking grants to purchase textbooks and reference books explaining the overall situation of their library.
- Proposals should include separate list of textbooks and reference books deemed essential, the prices of the books, and the number of copies required.

- The agreed amount will be provided after the completion of the program and the submission of the report.
- After completion of the event, detail description of the program and documents should be submitted to the UGC.
- To apply for support, the proposals should be submitted in a prescribed format of the Quality Improvement Program of the Commission. The amounts for such support is decided depending upon the nature of the seminar/workshop/conference, duration of the program, number of participants, objectives of the event, and the possible impact of the program. Below is the range of the support that can be provided to such events:

- Proposals should arrive at the UGC office within the deadline set by the notice or the circular issued by the Commission.
- The grants received under this program should be used only for the purchase of textbooks and reference books.
- In the case of constituent campuses, a grant for books and journals can be provided if the campus/department is running a new degree course, or a new subject is going to be added at the Master's level.

(The list of grants disbursed to campuses for purchasing books is presented in Annex G.)

### 4.6.2 Grants for Purchasing Furniture

Under this program, grants can be provided to community campuses to purchase furniture for libraries. The process is as follows:

- The campus should submit a proposal along with the detail on the situation of furniture in their library.
- The proposal should also include details on the furniture needed.
- The proposal should arrive within the deadline mentioned in notices or the circulars issued by the Commission.
- The proposal should mention the amount sought from the UGC and the amount that the campus can bear.
- Support received under this heading should be used strictly towards procuring furnitures listed.

(The list of grants disbursed to campuses for purchasing furniture is given in Annex H.)

#### 4.6.3 Grants for Purchasing Computer

The Commission also provides grants to community campuses to purchase computers to help them efficiently execute their administrative and academic activities through a systematic use of information technology. To receive this support, the campuses should apply within the deadline and the grant thus received should be used only to procure computers. The amount approved is released only after the bills are furnished to the UGC.

(The list of grants disbursed to campuses for purchasing computers is presented in Annex I.)

#### 4.6.4 Physical Facility Development

Grants under this program are provided to add classrooms and library rooms in community campuses which are running Bachelor's or Master's courses. The operational procedure to obtain the grants is given below:

- Proposals, which have to be submitted within the deadline, should explain the current

situation of classrooms and library rooms, reasons for adding the rooms and the estimated cost.

- A partial grant can be provided on the basis of matching fund depending on the physical situation of the campus and the number of students.
- The campus receiving the grant should submit a report on the expenditure details for the construction of library room/ classrooms.
- The UGC can monitor or supervise the activities under this funding program.

(The list of grants disbursed to campuses for construction purpose is presented in Annex J.)

#### 4.6.5 Development of Teaching Materials

Under this program, financial support is provided to institutions to publish books, reference materials, and study materials by forming an expert taskforce or by organizing workshops on a specific subject. To receive this support, proposals should be submitted by a university, campus, Dean's office, subject committee, department or educational institution. The proposal must mention the names of experts, date, venue, and period of the event as well as the number of participants.

### 4.7 Miscellaneous /Extra Activities in 2009/10

#### 4.7.1 Staff Recruitment

#### 4.7.2 Submission of Reports

##### 4.7.2.1 Report on Birgunj University

The Government of Nepal had proposed to establish a university in Birgunj through its budget of the fiscal year 2066/67. For this the Ministry of Education had requested the UGC to carry out a feasibility study. A task force was formed on 28<sup>th</sup> October 2009 for this purpose.

The task force submitted a report based on the Terms of Reference (TOR) and the report is primarily based on the discussions and interactions carried out at different stages with local as well as central level educationists, opinion leaders, political personalities, social workers, decision makers and other stakeholders.

The task force had submitted its Feasibility Study Report recommending for the establishment of the university to the Chairman of UGC at a program held in the UGC office on 27<sup>th</sup> January 2010. The then UGC Member-Secretary Prof. Dr. Vinod Kumar Shrestha and the Chief Administrative Officer Mr. Subas Chandra Dhungel were also present on the occasion.

##### 4.7.2.2 Report on Establishment of South Asian University/ Nepal Regional Campus

A study team formed on 26<sup>th</sup> August 2009 to explore the possibility of establishing a South Asian Regional Campus in Nepal had submitted its report on 26 September 2009. The UGC had formed the study team consisting of the following individuals:

On the basis of the ToR, the study team began its activities immediately and conducted 22 meetings on various dates. It also consulted available literature on the SAU and various other published and unpublished reports and websites. It also compiled a list of prominent experts in the field of science, technology, education, management, engineering, and social studies. The report is prepared and submitted based on the comments and suggestions of the experts and the findings and observations of the Study Team.

Based on deliberations with various experts, discussions held with team members, present available capacity of Nepali universities and the Government of Nepal-owned institutions, the study team proposed one of the following two courses to be taught at the proposed SAU/NRC:

- Master of Science in Mountain Studies
- Master of Arts in Peace Studies

The study team recommended that Master of Science in Mountain Studies be conducted first, since Nepal has already developed capacity and skills needed for teaching and learning process in Mountain Studies.

#### 4.7.2.3 Report on Ayurveda College

The UGC on 3<sup>rd</sup> March, 2010 had formed a five-member task force to study the feasibility of a college in Dang. The task force on feasibility of Ayurveda College submitted its report on 19<sup>th</sup> May 2010 with recommendations to establish Ayurveda College along with a teaching hospital under the Nepal Sanskrit University (NSU).

The task force led by Dr. Dhanik Lal Bharkher handed the report over Dr. Kamal Krishna Joshi, the Chairman of the UGC at a programme organized in the UGC hall.

The UGC had formed the task force consisted of the following:

- Prof. Dr. Dhanik Lal Bharkher - Co-ordinator

#### 4.7.2.4 Report on National Eligibility Test (NET)

The taskforce formed for the feasibility study on the national eligibility test submitted its report on 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2010, recommending positive suggestions for the establishment of NET examination for postgraduate candidates who wish to qualify for university level teaching jobs.

The UGC at a meeting held on Tuesday, 20<sup>th</sup> April 2010 decided to form a three-member task force for the study on the NET. The task force was headed by Prof. Dr. Sundar Shyam Bhakta Mathema recommended to the UGC on the administration of NET to determine eligibility for lectureship in

order to ensure minimum standards for the entrants in the teaching profession and research for university level in Nepal.

The composition of the task force was as follows:

- Prof. Dr. Sundar Shyam Bhakta Mathema – Co-ordinator

#### 4.7.3 Attachment Visit and Staff Training

The UGC made a five day attachment visit to the UGC, India from January 6<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> 2010. The visit was arranged by UGC Nepal and UGC India as a part of an information exchange initiative.

Chief Administrative Officer, Subas Chandra Dhungel, Programme Officer Rojnath Pandey, Monitoring and Evaluation Officer Dambar Lal Shrestha, Planning and Program Officer Dinesh Mani Ghimire, and Planning and Monitoring Officer Dipesh Singh participated in the visit. The participants visited and interacted with the UGC India authorities and other relevant personnel during the 5 day attachment visit.

During their stay in Delhi, they visited the International Relation Division, Research Bureau, and Financial Administration Bureau and interacted with bureau heads of UGC India. They also visited the Education Management Information System at Regional Office of UGC India and were informed about the research funding in higher education through UGC and disbursement modalities of UGC India.

The Delegation of UGC Nepal met with Dr. Manju Singh, Joint Secretary; Ashok Mahajan, Deputy Secretary Subash Chandra, Deputy Secretary and Coordinator - Information and Statistics Bureau V. K. Jaiswal, Under Secretary of UGC India.

During the visit, they also participated in an Enhancing Capacity Training Program.

#### 4.7.4 Participation on APQN Conference of the UGC Members

The Members of the UGC Prof. Krishna Manandhar and Prof. Bharat Jha attended the 2010 APQN Conference and AGM held in Bangkok, Thailand from 3<sup>rd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> March, 2010.

The conference was hosted by the Office for National Education Standards and Quality Assessment (ONESQA) Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization (SEAMEO), Regional Centre for Higher Education Development (RIHED) and the Commission on Higher Education (CHE), Thailand.

The APQN Conference and AGM is the main annual event for the discussion on the advancement of quality assurance in higher education throughout the Asia and Pacific region. APQN members from different Asian countries participated in the Conference and AGM.

The main aims of the Conference were to highlight current challenges and issues of QA in Higher Education; share good practices in QA of institutions and quality agencies; to enhance regional cooperation amongst agencies and to share a regional vision on quality in higher education.

#### 4.7.5 Radio Program

The UGC has launched a radio program named 'Uchha Shikchha Gatibidhi', from 1<sup>st</sup> July 2010 from the national broadcasting station 'Radio Nepal'. The program, running from 6:25 pm to 6:40 pm every second and fourth Thursday of the month was started with the objective of disseminating regular activities of the Commission to the general public.

#### 4.7.6 17th Anniversary of the UGC

The UGC celebrated its 17<sup>th</sup> anniversary by organizing a special program on Tuesday, 23<sup>rd</sup> November 2010 to mark the approbation of UGC Act, 2050 by the parliament.

The program was chaired by Prof. Shanti Devi Sharma, senior board member of the UGC. State Minister for Education, Mr. Govinda Chaudhary was the Chief-Guest of the program. Former chairmen and member-secretaries of UGC, vice chancellors of different universities, professors, educationists, teachers, members of different committees of UGC, journalists, and UGC staff participated in the program.

On this occasion, the UGC officials presented the annual progress report on regular and SHEP activities of the UGC. Chief Administrative Officer Subas Chandra Dhungel, in his welcome speech, also highlighted the annual progress of the UGC. Finance Controller Kedar Prasad Acharya thanked all the distinguished guests for their participation in the ceremony.



## PART V : SECOND HIGHER EDUCATION PROJECT (SHEP)

### 5.1 Introduction of SHEP

Based on the experiences of the first higher education project (1997-2002) and critical reflections on its outcomes, it was deemed necessary by the stakeholders (including the teachers, students, business and industry and policy level individuals) that there needed a more comprehensive reform initiative to achieve and sustain quality higher education in Nepal. The initiatives were exacted to instill a professional culture with emphasis on academic activities and research that assures and sustains better quality; achieves financial sustainability of higher education institutions; and ensures equitable access of higher education to qualified students from poor and disadvantaged sectors. Second Higher Education Project (SHEP) was conceived with the aim of addressing these felt needs. In 2006 the government of Nepal and IDA signed an agreement of cooperation and support for SHEP. Accordingly IDA agreed to provide grants in aid equivalent to \$ 60 million for the project. The government of Nepal pledged for gradual incremental contribution to the operating cost of SHEP subsequently taking full responsibility of sustaining the systemic reforms brought by the project. The project has been in effect since July 27, 2007 and will continue until 2014.

The main objectives of SHEP are to achieve:

- Enhanced quality and relevance of higher education and research through a set of incentives for promoting effective management and financial sustainability of academic institutions.

- Improved access for academically qualified under-privileged students, including female *Dalits* and educationally disadvantaged *Janajatis* to higher education through financial assistance and enhanced capacity build up of higher secondary schools.

Specifically SHEP aims to:

- Bring reform in higher education institutions through incentives for indicator based performance progress and matching the resource mobilization initiatives.
- Bring improvements in teaching and learning with strengthened research capability
- Bring improvements in governance management and financial sustainability.
- Establish a student financial assistance scheme to ensure equity in access to higher education for academically capable but economically disenfranchised students.
- Establish a system of quality assurance and accreditation system and
- Establish an EMIS system for Higher Education.

The project has the following four major components:

- Reform Grants
- Student Financial Assistance
- Enhancing Higher Secondary Education, and
- Strengthening System Capacity

### Component 1: Reform Grants

Reform grants has two sub components: (I) Institutional reform grants and (II) Research funding.

Institutional reform grants have the following provisions:

- Incentive grants for the TU for the preparation of Campus and Institutional Autonomy Regulation 2062.
- Incentives for TU constituent campuses for in-house consultation and preparation of strategic plan for autonomy and development.
- Incentive for decentralized TU constituent campus upon signing of MOU for campus autonomy.
- Incentive for TU for granting autonomy by signing an MOU with its decentralized campus that have fulfilled the requirements and have duly applied for autonomy.
- Incentive grants for other universities for signing the MOU and the agreement for formula based funding.
- Performance grants for TU autonomous campuses, selected community campuses and other universities.
- Matching grants for TU autonomous campuses, selected TU decentralized campuses, selected community campuses and other universities.

Research funding consisted of the following provisions:

- Training and seminars on research and professional/academic enhancements.
- Scholarships for Ph.D., and Post Doc.
- Support for M. Phil and Masters thesis preparation.
- Faculty research for individuals and groups.
- TU library strengthening.
- Networking of libraries and research laboratories and academic testing services.
- Strengthening of research laboratories.
- Development of research management cells.
- Conducting university-industry dialogues.

### Component 2: Student Financial Assistance

The provisions under student financial assistance consist of:

- Student scholarships: a) Higher Secondary students and b) Bachelor Students.
- Student loan for Bachelor students.
- Support for work-study schemes for Higher Secondary students and Bachelor Level students.

### Component 3: Enhancing Higher Secondary Education

- Basic Grants.
- Performance Grants, and
- Matching Grants.

### Component 4: Strengthening System Capacity

The tasks under this component include:

- Development of QAA System.
- Development of Higher Education EMIS.
- Higher Education Policy Studies, and
- Institutional Capacity Building.

## 5.2 Implementation Arrangement

The UGC has been entrusted with the implement of the components 1, 2, and 4 while the Department of Education (DOE) will implement component 3. Student Financial Assistance Fund Development Board (SFAFDB) under the Chairmanship of the UGC and an office headed by a Director of SFAFDB has been created for the implementation of component 2. Similarly, the structure of UGC has been extended with Research Council and Quality Assurance and Accreditation Committee. Research Division and QAA division have been established at the UGC office headed by their respective Directors.

## 5.3 Progress Summary

Institutional reform grants that constitute the main SHEP grants provisions, have allocated almost 60% of the total SHEP grants. The institutional reform grants has three important provisions: *Incentive Grants* for important initiatives and preparatory tasks; *Performance Grants* for motivating better

performance in terms of services, quality, efficiency, credibility, transparency and inclusivity; and **Matching Grants** to provide funding support to the reform initiatives taken by the institutions. Most of the incentive grants, (all except the incentive grants provisioned for TU campus autonomy), have already been disbursed to the selected participating campuses and universities as per project provisions. Some of the participating campuses have received two rounds of performance grants while others have received only the first round of funding. Many of the participating campuses and universities have also received matching grants.

**Research funding** support which is about 7.5% of the total grant has been provisioned to inculcate research culture in higher education by motivating faculty members to engage in research activities through team work and with the involvement of students; to engage in research training/orientation and to enter in dialogues with industry and business stake holders for mutually beneficial cooperation and collaborations. It also aims to enhance library and laboratories to turn them into research supportive facilities. Research Funding supports are provided on the basis of annual program provisions. Two rounds of annual support provisions are already accomplished and the third round of provisions are on the process.

SHEP has started the **Student Financial Assistance** with the grants of \$4 million (6.7% of the total). This provision aims to support academically eligible students from poor and disadvantaged communities meet the cost of their education at higher secondary level and higher education level which include meeting the basic living costs,

tuition fees, admission fees, examination fee learning materials and costs of transportation. The provisions of student support include **grant-scholarship, work-study support** program, and **student loans** (for bachelor's students). The scheme envisages expansion of the provision with the growth of the fund through fund raising activities. Two rounds of student selection verification and provision of the support have already been made. The third round is in process.

Higher secondary education component is designed to improve access to higher education for rural students. For this, SHEP assists community higher secondary schools to expand enrolment and improve the quality of education. The provisions under this component include basic grants to a community higher secondary schools meeting basic accountability requirements to upgrade physical facilities and build the capacity of the teachers. Schools that have a good performance track record and a reasonable level of enrollment also receive performance grants.

Under the fourth component, supporting the enhancement of the capacity of higher education system; some progress has been observed: 1) in establishing a national Quality Assurance and Accreditation (QAA) system, 2) in developing comprehensive Higher Education Management Information System (HEMIS), and 3) in providing opportunities for staff training. The project is preparing to initiate policy research and dialogue for establishing a culture of knowledge based reform practices in higher education.

## 5.4 Major Thrusts of SHEP Implementation

SHEP provisions of performance grants and matching grants have motivated higher education institutions including the universities and campuses to participate in the reform process; motivated faculty members for participation in research activities with the research funding support on competitive basis, and attracted higher education institutions to take a stake in quality assessment and accreditation. It has established and implemented a system of student financial assistance; made significant improvement in the access to and development of quality higher secondary education through community based schools; and established the systems of QAA and EMIS. Of all the reform thrusts, three aspects seem to have given momentum in setting the course towards the aspired goals:

- Recognition and Support to Community Participation in the Higher Education Reform.
- Establishment of a system of monitoring performance progress and grants provision on the basis of set indicators and criteria.
- Development of quality assurance and accreditation system.

## 5.5 Recognition and Support to Community Participation in the Higher Education Reform

Recognition of the community based campuses as important non-profit public higher education entities and ensuring their participation in the SHEP reform grants program is a very important step towards enhancement and consolidation of the participation of stakeholders in higher education. Community campuses now come under a well defined framework as owned by the campus, supported and managed by community; governed by general bodies consisting of community

stakeholders and representatives; managed by the campus management committee which is duly constituted and renewed as per campus constitutions and directives and accountable to public scrutiny. Its property is forfeited by the government, in case of failure to operate.

Most of the community campuses in the country are affiliated to TU. They rely on TU for academic programs, curriculum, calendar, and examination, but are autonomous in management, operation and resource mobilization. This recognition has a very important impact on government policy, commitment and provisioning support for community initiatives and participation in higher education. Subsequent to the recognition, UGC has provisioned regular grant fund for the community campuses on the basis of two fundamental indicators which rely on the number of students and the programs that the campuses are running.

Community campuses are contributing to higher education in the country by mobilizing resources locally. In the absence of government policies and regulations for support, the community campuses face many challenges towards achieving financial sustenance. They are therefore undertaking drives to ensure adequate student enrolment; keeping a dynamic fee structure to ensure cost recovery while also ensuring the consents of the community and stakeholders including students and parents. Most importantly, they have to prove their worth particularly in terms of the examination results and their outlooks so that new students find reasons to enroll in these campuses paying higher fees than in the constituent campuses and at the same time not choosing private campuses. Nevertheless, most of the community campuses have succeeded in establishing their credibility. They have also

established their confidence and proven their capacity in their participation of SHEP reform programs.

SHEP had initially provisioned support for 10 community campuses with reform grants, of which 9 were selected from national and regional level competitions in 2008. Success of these campuses in undertaking reform activities in terms of measurable performance indicators drew interest and demands from other campuses. Subsequently, the provision has been expanded to other community campuses as well; categorizing the first selected 9 campuses as scheme A. Provisions have been made for additional 10 moderately sized campuses under scheme B and they were selected from national and regional level competition. Similarly, additional provisions have been made for supporting one campus in every district each selected from district level competitions in the districts not covered by scheme A or B. A total of 47 community campuses are currently participating in SHEP reform grants and there has been a continued demand for more participation.

Scheme A campuses have undergone two cycles of performance assessment whereas scheme B and C have completed one cycle of performance assessment. Scheme A campuses have also received matching grants and some of them have completed Quality Assurance and Accreditation (QAA) cycle. One of the campuses, Balkumari College in Bharatpur, Chitawan has already been QAA accredited.

The other important achievement of the project is the in-house consultations and interactions in TU constituent campuses to analyze the issues and challenges of current management and to explore possibilities for reform. 24 such TU constituent campuses have taken such initiatives making

efforts to build consensus towards empowerment of the campus managements through attainment of autonomy status. Further, ten decentralized TU campuses succeeded in getting selected for SHEP reform grants; they are now in the process of receiving performance grants and matching grants.

Recently, in 2010, one of the campuses, Mahendra Ratna Multiple Campus (MRMC), Ilam has successfully attained the status of TU autonomous campus as per TU campus/institutional autonomy regulation 2062 (BS). The campus was awarded SHEP incentive grants of Rs. 13 Million and has become eligible for reform grants up to Rs. 162.5 Million.

As per the SHEP reform grants requirement, all the participating institutions, including the universities and campuses have prepared strategic development plans with the participation of the stakeholders and through consensus approach. This has helped the campuses establish team work and also build consolidated network of the stakeholders.

#### Matching Grant

In recognition of the community participation in the development of higher education institutions SHEP has provisioned matching grants at the ratio of 1:1 (resources mobilized by the institution matched by an equal amount from the Project) for undertaking activities to further develop the institution. This provision has helped highlight self responsibility and initiatives of participating institutions for community mobilization.

#### 5.6 Performance Indicators

A system has been established for performance based progress evaluation of the participating institutions using specific criteria and quantifiable indicators.

Performance grants are provided to the participating institutions on the strength of the annual progress that are verified on the basis of documentary evidences. Under this provision, the participating autonomous campus, universities (other than TU) and Scheme A Community campuses are eligible for performance grants of up to

Rs. 97,500,000 with the reform grants ceiling of Rs. 162,500,000; each decentralized campuses and community campuses selected under scheme B are eligible for performance up to Rs. 13,000,000 within a total reform grants ceiling of Rs. 26,000,000. Community campuses under scheme C can get up to Rs. 2,600,000 in performance grants with reform grants ceiling of Rs.5,200,000.

The performance based grants have motivated the campuses to prepare strategic plan and undertake development initiatives according to the criteria and the indicators. The provision of performance grants has helped the participating institutions become functionally aware of the importance of performance monitoring and comply with a framework of performance data. It has also helped them take necessary measures for establishing a data system. The effort of indicators based performance assessment and grants provision has necessitated all the concerned institutions including

the UGC and the universities and the campuses to take serious steps to initiate EMIS. SHEP has, in this line, prepared a comprehensive plan for higher education EMIS. It has started annual publication of higher education statistics for tracking the progress of the implementation of the project. The UGC has already identified and listed system indicators and project indicators necessary for the publication and for project monitoring.

### 5.7 Quality Assurance and Accreditation (QAA) System

SHEP performance grants has a provision of tracking quality improvement in the participating institutions in terms of five indicators - i) completing the process of quality assurance and accreditation cycle; ii) attaining the status of quality accreditation; iii) attracting increasing number of applications for enrolment in the academic programs that have defined number of student places (intake seat capacity); iv) undertaking the tracer studies of the graduates; and v) attaining progress in employment status of its graduates. Of all these five indicators, the first two are the most important ones as they indicate the commitment and initiatives of the institution to take a stake for quality status and actually get the accreditation for attainment of at least a defined threshold of quality. The other three indicators could be considered

subsequent to the attainment of the first two indicators. In fact, the progress in terms of all the 14 performance indicators provisioned in SHEP for tracking the progress and providing performance grants are mutually related and mainly follow the

progress in terms of the first two indicators. This is because of the fact that QAA system has developed a comprehensive framework of criteria, key aspects and indicators to assess quality.

Each criterias are specified in terms of several key aspects and further defined in terms of measurable indicators. Weightages are given to each of the criteria and are further specified in terms of 120 measurable indicators with the total mark of 100.

An institution should meet basic eligibility criteria to participate in QAA process and should score 50% or more for accreditation.

QAA system motivates and also challenges the institutions for enhancing overall institutional quality and staking for quality accreditation status. QAA cycle completion requires full participation and compliance in quality assurance and accreditation process - formal application for participation in QAA process, undertaking self assessment and preparing a comprehensive Self Study Report (SSR), and independent evaluation by a peer review team (PRT) appointed by Quality Assurance and Accreditation Committee (QAAC). The UGC confers the status of accreditation to successful institution on the basis of the PRT evaluation report and recommendations of QAAC.

All 9 community campuses selected for participation in SHEP Scheme A Reform Grants have completed the Self Evaluation Report and submitted it to the UGC for final assessment and accreditation. 4 have already completed the QAA cycle; one of the campuses, Balkumari College, has been accredited.

After two cycles of QAA processing, including peer reviews and observation of the campuses and accreditation of one of the campuses, the system has now reached a new stage; it is now open for all the interested institutions through public announcement. The provisions, rules and regulations are publicized through the UGC website. In response to the public announcement, many campuses have applied for participation in QAA. Nine campuses, including constituent campuses, community campuses and private campuses that were found eligible for participation are now in the process of preparing their self study report.

Kathmandu University (KU) has come forward by applying for accreditation. Similarly engineering colleges and one medical college have come forward to participate in the QAA process. Following this development, frameworks have been developed in consultation with the universities and Professional Councils to set up effective and

justifiable QAA processes for Universities and professional institutions/ campuses. Collaborative arrangements are made to address these cases.

Gradually, QAA is gaining momentum. Steps have already been taken to form a National QAA Board to fully take charge of QAA responsibility in the country.

## 5.8 Reflecting on the Issues and Challenges

Overall, SHEP has made some breakthrough in mobilizing community campuses for participatory approach for reform and development in higher education, establishing indicators based performance monitoring and grants provision; establishing and implementing QAA systems for quality assurance through accreditation of the institutions that meet quality thresholds. In the process of SHEP implementation, EMIS has also been set up. In addition to the major thrust discussed above, the project has also brought significant development in other aspects of the project – it has expanded the opportunities for the teachers and institutions to participate in research and academic professional activities; there has been an established and operationalized scheme for student financial assistance and improved access to higher education through improvement in quality and access of higher secondary education.

Despite many achievements, implementation of SHEP has also encountered some crucial hurdles and challenges. The political milieu in the country has had a tremendous impact on the operational management and development of the institutions. The positive aspect of such an impact is that the institutions are getting increasingly cautious, transparent, and better prepared to face unforeseen situation. The negative impact is that the institutions are drawn more into non-academic tasks. Academic calendar in many institutions remained rather as a concept than guiding document. Political commitment and cooperation at the campus as well as at the national level seemed very crucial to stabilize the institutions and

implement the reform initiatives steadily.

It is essential in a project planning stage to set targets and make provisions accordingly; SHEP is not an exception. Given that many of the concepts and practices that SHEP intended to bring in higher education reform are new, it was felt in course of SHEP implementation that the participating institutions/campuses needed counseling and technical support to be able to fully understand and participate meaningfully and effectively. Hence, some of the targets anticipated by the project seemed to miss the nuances and challenges of the preparatory work needed. It was found necessary during the project implementation that quantitative targets need to be revisited.

Similarly, many challenges are faced by the participating institutions while following the requirements of matching grants and procurement procedures. This is because of the limited economic situation of the institutions and the general environment of the country. Most of the institutes do not have sufficient fund to confidently plan and execute them. Most of their undertakings are piece meal and dependent on the available resources and opportunities, which come in pieces as well.

The other challenging issue is the provision of disbursement as an indicator of achievements. SHEP implementation in terms of disbursement has been very poor and due to this, concerns have been raised about the achievement of the goals given the current implementation provisions and approaches and that the goals of the project may be difficult to

achieve in stipulated time. However, most of the reform undertakings are beyond simple objective actions. Obviously, there is a need for revisiting the performance indicators and extrapolating the disbursement and progress attainment in a more dynamic and composite way. Disbursement takes place when the institutions are readied not only in terms of awareness and participation but when they become capable in undertaking the tasks and absorb/spend the fund.

The experiences of implementing the project have brought up a realization that reform in higher education is rather complex and challenging. Overall, the project is still in a formative stage. This is understood by SHEP management and has therefore provisioned regular reviews as well as overall project Mid Term Review (MTR) for timely feedback and reform in the project policy and provisions. Based on these reviews, it has been realized that the overall SHEP goals and strategies are in the right direction. However achieving the project goals and the targets remain difficult challenges because of the complex milieu of higher education in the country. In the milieu, TU stands as the most important aspect and covers the major portion of the reform challenges. In this regard, the currently accomplished MTR in last February and the following mission in July have come up with a list of suggestions for improvements in the project implementation that included restructuring the modality of project implementation. Accordingly, project preparations have been made both in TU and the UGC for setting up implementation units to take up the project Implementation challenges.

QAA dissemination seminars were held at the regional level. These seminars were aimed at bringing awareness among all university campus chiefs, teachers, academics concerned and other higher education stakeholders. It was expected that

the seminars would prepare and motivate the institutions and academics to initiate necessary steps towards QAA exercise. This was augmented by the orientation training programme to take steps towards preparing a self study report. Other

workshops and consultation meetings were aimed at providing technical and procedural support in the process of completing QAA cycle. The activities under technical support aimed QAA system development including finalization / revision of QAA guidelines, and preparation of legal framework as well as.

An important outcome of the QAA system development and activities, the nine selected community. Two of the nine campuses have successfully prepared their full SSR report. Among them, Balkumari College completed all the

requirements for Peer Review. The Technical Committee recommended for Peer Review Team (PRT) visit for assessment and process for accreditation. Accordingly QAAC formed a PRT that included senior professors as well as an international expert and was coordinated by the QAA division of the UGC. The PRT field visit was successfully accomplished and accordingly produced assessment along with a report. The assessment and the report have already been submitted to QAAC for final decision regarding accreditation.
