General Introduction

Consulate General of Nepal Kolkata is one of the oldest diplomatic missions of Nepal. We offer various consular services to Nepali nationals and foreign nationals. Such services may include issuing passports, recommendation letters, and No Objection Certificates for Nepali nationals. Attestation of documents and rescue and repatriation of Nepali nationals are also prioritised business of the Consulate.

West Bengal is a crucial place for Nepal in terms of trade (both import and export), employment, culture, social engagement, tourism, and many more. Both demography and geography play a very important role in Nepal's trade, economy, and society. In fact, the Kolkata corridor is the lifeline of Nepal's third country (other than India) trade. Two riverine (riparian) ports at Kolkata and Haldia are especially of foremost importance.

The Consulate facilitates the smooth and hassle-free movement of Nepal-bound cargo consisting of goods, materials and commodities imported from around the world via seaways. Such goods are transshipped and handled in these ports and transported up to Nepal by rail and trucks.

News and Events

Right Honourable Prime Minister Sushila Karki, who is also in charge of the foreign ministry, has urged Nepali ambassadors and diplomatic missions serving abroad to explore the possibility of granting voting rights to Nepali citizens living, staying, and working abroad during her first virtual interaction with them.

In her first virtual meeting with the envoys, she outlined five

directives. She briefed them on the political developments following the Gen-Z movement, emphasizing the government's



priority of holding free and fair elections on March 5, 2026. She urged ambassadors to provide recommendations on practical models for out-of-country voting and to coordinate closely with host nations, international organisations, and observer groups. Karki highlighted the government's commitment to good governance, the welfare of migrant workers, tourism revival, and proactive diplomacy as Nepal prepares for LDC graduation. Altogether, 44 diplomats participated in the briefing, during which she reiterated the missions' crucial role in representing Nepal's national interests.

Altogether, 44 Nepali diplomats, including Nepal's permanent representatives and consuls general, were present in the briefings.

The Consulate General of Nepal in Kolkata organized a special meet-and-discussion program with members of the Nepali diaspora residing in Kolkata. The event, held at the Consulate premises, aimed to strengthen community relations and enhance engagement with Nepali nationals living in Kolkata.

During the program, the Consul General Jhakka Prasad Acharya introduced the newly posted officials and exchanged

warm greetings with the attendees. Community members shared updates about their livelihoods, business activities, and overall experiences in Kolkata, creating an open platform for dialogue and mutual understanding. The discussion was on the progress and architectural development of the Pashupatinath Temple in Kolkata. Officials and participants exchanged views on ongoing works, future plans, and the cultural significance of the temple for the Nepali community.

Trade and Investment

Nepal's Consulate Office in Kolkata plays a vital role in deepening economic cooperation between Nepal and India, with a primary focus on **trade facilitation** and **attracting Indian foreign direct investment (FDI)**. As Nepal's closest diplomatic mission to the eastern economic hub of India, the Consulate serves as an essential link between Nepali businesses, Indian authorities, and regional commercial institutions.

One of its most important responsibilities is supporting and simplifying Nepal's trade through the **Port of Kolkata**, which is the lifeline for Nepal's third-country import and export. Since Nepal is a landlocked country, smooth operations at Kolkata Port and Haldia Port are crucial for the movement of goods to and from global markets. The Consulate coordinates closely with port authorities, customs offices, shipping agents, and logistics providers to ensure timely clearance, reduce bottlenecks, and resolve any trade-related issues that may affect Nepal's international commerce.

In addition to trade facilitation, the Consulate actively promotes Indian FDI into Nepal. It engages with Indian industries, chambers of commerce, and potential investors to showcase Nepal's investment-friendly environment, highlighting key sectors such as hydropower, tourism, infrastructure, manufacturing, agriculture, and ICT. By organizing business interactions, participating in trade fairs, and encouraging cross-border partnerships, the Consulate works to attract new investments that can support Nepal's economic growth and create long-term bilateral economic ties.

In line with the core foreign policy objectives of Nepal, the Consulate consistently undertakes activities aimed at promoting economic diplomacy. The promotion of Nepali tourism, language, culture, values, and—above all—the dignity of Nepal in West Bengal, India, remains a top priority for the Consulate. To this end, the Consulate regularly engages with Indian authorities, the Nepali community, welfare societies, business associations, and various other professional and social organizations.

Mejor Participations and Engagements

The inaugural flight at Kolkata Airport was graciously inaugurated by Mr. Jhakka Prasad Acharya, Consul General of

is expected to boost tourism, trade, and people-to-people exchanges. This initiative reflects the growing partnership and cooperation between the two neighbouring nations.

Consul General Mr. Jhakka Prasad Acharya participated as the Guest of Honour and speaker at the Gelephu Road Show held on 17 July 2025. Which was organised by PHDCCI, Kolkata, India. Gelephu, located in Bhutan, is an emerging tourist destination and a key point along the India–Bhutan border. The event highlighted trilateral cooperation among India, Nepal, and Bhutan in promoting bilateral trade, tourism, and sustainable development. In his remarks, Mr. Acharya emphasised the opportunities Nepal can harness from India, particularly the eastern region such as West Bengal. He also noted that both Nepal and Bhutan can benefit greatly from enhanced regional connectivity and shared economic initiatives.

The Merchant's Chamber of Commerce & Industry (MCCI), Kolkata, organized a special session on "Challenges and Opportunities for Trade at Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port, Kolkata (SMPK)" on Friday, 8 August 2025. The program featured the Chairman of Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port, Mr. Rathendra Raman, along with a large number of participants from the Indian business community, port authorities, and customs officials.

The Chamber, in partnership with CCG Marketing & Services, is organizing the **India International Grand Trade Fair 2025** from 24 October to 3 November 2025 at City Square Ground, Newtown, Kolkata, as part of its 125th Anniversary celebrations.

As a Guest speaker Consul General Mr. Jhakka Prasad Acharya addressed the inaugural ceremony of the India

International Grand Trade Fair 2025, praising the Chamber and CCG Marketing & Services for organizing one of eastern India's leading trade platforms. He highlighted the fair's role in promoting business networking, investment and



international cooperation. Mr. Acharya emphasized Bengal's strategic position as a regional trade and logistics hub connecting Nepal, Bhutan, and Bangladesh. He also noted the importance of MSMEs, start-ups, and the growing participation of Nepali entrepreneurs in strengthening Nepal-India economic ties. The Consul General concluded by expressing hope that the fair would further enhance regional collaboration and shared prosperity. The Consul General of Nepal, Mr. Jhakka Prasad Acharya, was invited as the keynote speaker for the event. In his address, Consul General Acharya highlighted the various hurdles faced by Nepali businesses at

the port and emphasised the need for infrastructure upgrades and improved facilitation to support Nepali traders.

condolences on the passing of Her Majesty, the Queen of Thailand. In this regard, the Consul General, along with officials from the Consulate, visited the Royal Thai Consulate-General



in Kolkata to convey their sympathy and offer a formal condolence message. The Consulate expressed deep sorrow over the loss and reaffirmed its solidarity with the people and the Royal Family of Thailand during this time of mourning.

The Nepali Janakalyan Samiti, Howrah, celebrated the **212th birth anniversary of the revered Nepali poet Bhanubhakta Acharya** on 20 July 2025. The Samiti, which has long been dedicated to preserving and promoting Nepali language, culture, and literature in Kolkata, organized a special commemorative program on the occasion and also inaugurated its annual literary magazine, *Bihani*.

The Consul General of Nepal, **Mr. Jhakka Prasad Acharya**, was invited as the Chief Guest and formally inaugurated *Bihani*. The event featured a variety of cultural performances in Nepali, Hindi, and Bengali, reflecting the rich diversity and shared heritage of the community. The program saw active participation from the Nepali community, poets, local literary writers, and distinguished guests. Notable dignitaries included a Minister from West Bengal and the Ambassador of Nepal from the Embassy of Nepal in India.

The Consulate General Office of Nepal, Kolkata, was invited to participate in the East Coast Maritime & Logistics Summit 2025 held on 2–3 September at Novotel Varun Beach, Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh. Consul General Mr. Jhakka Prasad Acharya attended the summit, accompanied by Deputy Consul General Mr. Janak Raj Bhatta, along with members of the **Nepali business community**. The event was organized by Maritime Gateway in collaboration with the Global Forum for Sustainable Transformation. Their participation was particularly significant as Visakhapatnam Port is one of the designated Indian ports permitted for Nepali trade, making the discussions highly relevant for Nepal's trade facilitation. The summit brought together key stakeholders from the maritime and logistics sectors to explore opportunities for enhanced regional connectivity and cooperation.

The Nepal Consulate General Office in Kolkata successfully carried out the rescue of missing and untraceable Nepali citizens in West Bengal. The Consulate coordinated with local authorities to ensure their safety and proper identification. After the rescue, the individuals were transported to the Nepal–India border at Kakarvitta. They were then formally handed over to their families. The Consulate reaffirmed its commitment to safeguarding the welfare of Nepali nationals living or traveling in the region.

Consul General Mr. Jhakka Prasad Acharya warmly welcomed the newly posted officials to the Consulate General of Nepal in Kolkata.
