President of Nepal Paudyal Congratulates President Sisi on the Occasion of Egypt's Revolution Day



The Rt. Hon. President of Nepal, Mr. Ramchandra Paudel sent a congratulatory message to H.E. Mr. Abdel Fattah Al-Sisi, President of Egypt, on the occasion of Egypt's National Day and Revolution Day on July 23. In his message, President Paudel said:

"Nepal and Egypt have been enjoying excellent state of bilateral relations based on mutual trust and friendship ever since the establishment of diplomatic ties in 1957. Over the period, the growing people-to-people exchanges have further strengthened the bilateral relations between the two countries.



In the international arena, our two nations share common views on many global issues, including climate action, achieving world peace, stability and strengthening of international forums such as the United Nations, Non-Aligned Movement (NAM) and G-77. In this connection, I would like to take this opportunity to deeply appreciate Egypt's continued proactive role in promoting peace and stability in the region."



President of Nepal Paudyal Writes to King Abdullah II of Jordan



On August 24, 2025, Rt. Hon. President Ramchandra Paudel sent a letter to His Majesty King Abdulla II of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan, extending to him the warm greetings and sincere best wishes on behalf of the people and the Government of Nepal.

Appreciating Jordan's consistent efforts in promoting peace, stability and dialogue in the Middle East, President Paudel also expressed his admiration for the King's exemplary leadership in humanitarian values, conflict resolution and intercultural harmony.

Nepal and Jordan have enjoyed long-standing relations of trust, understanding and cooperation ever since the establishment of diplomatic relations in 1965.

Around 3,000 Nepali nationals are live and work in Jordan, including in the textile and garment sector. A G-G labor agreement was signed between the two countries in 2017.



Embassy organises Nepal-Egypt Business Seminar



The Embassy of Nepal in Cairo hosted an interactive program on 18 November 2025 to explore ways of expanding cooperation between Nepal and Egypt in key economic sectors, including trade, investment, and tourism.

Ambassador of Nepal to Egypt, Sushil K Lamsal, welcoming the participants, highlighted the promising prospects for enhanced business collaboration between the two nations. He noted that both Nepal and Egypt are demographically youthful societies with strong growth potential, supported by abundant natural and human resources. He emphasized the need for closer contacts between business and entrepreneurial communities of the two countries to

create opportunities for mutually beneficial partnerships. Speaking at the event, Mr. Galal Maher El Ghor, Representative of the Egyptian Chamber of Commerce, discussed emerging business opportunities in Egypt and expressed confidence that deeper engagement between the two sides.

From the Nepali side, Mr. Santosh Koirala, President of the Nepal Bankers' Association, and Mr. Roshan K.C., Chairman of Machhapuchhre Bank Ltd., expressed their appreciation for the opportunity to interact with Egyptian entrepreneurs. They expressed their readiness to collaborate with Egyptian businessmen in the areas of mutual interests.



Celebration of National Day 2025



The National Day and Constitution Day of Nepal was celebrated at the Embassy of Nepal in Cairo on September 19, 2024. Ambassador Sushil K Lamsal hoisted the national flag of Nepal at the chancery to mark the occasion, and spoke about the vital importance of the constitution in resolving conflicts in the country. The national anthem of Nepal was played during the flag-hoisting ceremony and the Embassy's staffs were present at the function.

On September 15, the Chamberlain of the Egyptian Presidency His Excellency Mr. Mohamed Atef called on the ambassador, and conveyed the greetings and best wishes of Egypt's President H.E. Mr. Abdel Fattah El-Sisi to Rt. Hon. President of Nepal Mr. Ramchandra Paudel on the occasion of the National Day of Nepal.



Egyptian Children Depict Nepal's Cultural Heritage



A Nepal-Egypt cultural festival and art competition was held on November 16 with the participation of 350 children from about 30 schools in Egypt, organized under the joint auspices of the Embassy of Nepal in Cairo and the National Center for Children's Culture of Egypt. The art competition, titled "Nepal through the Eyes of Egyptian Children", was held at the Children's Park in Sayyida Zeinab, the capital city of Cairo. Students selected from schools in Cairo and other cities of Egypt participated in the competition. The children created paintings reflecting Nepal's art, culture, history, natural heritage,

and daily life.

Ambassador Sushil K Lamsal welcomed the guests and participants, and spoke on Nepal's cultural and natural uniqueness and explained that the program aimed to inform children about international friendship, cooperation, and Nepal-Egypt relations. Ambassador Lamsal awarded medals and cash prizes to the first, second, and third place winners, prizes to the ten best students, and certificates of appreciation and T-shirts to all participants. The program also featured Egyptian dance performances, an exhibition of Nepali artworks and handicrafts, and displays related to children's culture.



Auditor General's Visit to Egypt



A three-member Nepali delegation led by Auditor General Toyam Raya visited Egypt from October 25-31, 2025 to participate in the 25th International Congress of Supreme Audit Institutions (XXV INCOSAI) held in Sharm El-Sheikh from October 27. The Congress was inaugurated by Prime Minister Mostafa Madbouly. The event brought together leaders and representatives from more than 190 audit and oversight institutions worldwide, as well as Egyptian ministers and senior officials. The INCOSAI conference is the apex decision-making body of the International Organization of Supreme Audit Institutions (INTOSAI), setting future directions for accountability and transparency worldwide.

It is a global forum that brings together the international audit community to discuss enhanced cooperation, knowledge exchange, and strategies to promote transparency, integrity, and the protection of public funds.

Other members of the Nepali delegation were Baikuntha Adhikari, Upa Mahalekharikshak (Secretary Level) and Chandrakanta Bhandari, Nayab Mahalekharikshak (Joint Secretary Level), both from the Office of the Auditor General of Nepal.



Ambassador Meets with Chairman of New Capital Development Company



On August 5, 2025, Ambassador Sushil K Lamsal met with Engineer Mr. Khaled Abbas, Chairman of the Board of Directors and Managing Director of the Administrative Capital for Urban Development Company (ACUD). The company is responsible for developing Egypt's new administrative capital. Ambassador Lamsal expressed happiness over the smooth operation of the administrative capital. He recalled the meeting with Egypt's Foreign Minister Badr Abdelatty in the New Administrative Capital (NAC) in October 2024, during which the Egyptian minister made a briefing on the diplomatic zone in NAC and encouraged foreign embassies in Egypt to move to the new seat of the Egyptian government.

Mr. Abbas thanked the ambassador for his visit and informed that it had been two years as of July 2023 that most of the entities of the Egyptian Government moved to the New Administrative Capital. This step was a huge challenge for the Egyptian government due to the big number of public workers who worked for different sectors of the government. He said that the initial plan for building the New Administrative Capital was to redevelop Cairo as a whole, but this was nearly impossible since Cairo is a huge, old, overly crowded city. That's why it was decided to build a new city from scratch that would be better planned and developed than Cairo and thus came the idea of the New Administrative Capital, he said.



Meditation in Al-Horreya Park



The Embassy of Nepal, in collaboration with the Jeevan Vigyan Foundation, Nepal, organized a meditation session under the theme “Meditation: One with Self, One with Nature” at Al-Horreya Park in Zamalek, Cairo on January 16.

Speaking on the occasion, Ambassador Mr. Sushil K. Lamsal said that Nepal was among the core group of six countries that initiated the United Nations resolution declaring 21 December as World Meditation Day, which was unanimously adopted by the UN General Assembly in December 2024. As a land of yoga and meditation, Nepal continues to draw upon the wisdom of its ancestors, and which continues to inform and shape the everyday lives of its people, he said.

Mr. Santosh Khadka, an instructor from the Jeevan Vigyan Foundation, led the meditation session. He guided participants through self-awakening meditation, emphasizing mindful breathing and inner awareness. The session included practices focused on deep relaxation, calmness, and inner peace. Deputy Chief of Mission Ms. Indira Gohiwar Aryal made a presentation on Nepal as a destination for health and wellness tourism. Ambassadors and members of the diplomatic corps, members of the Nepali community, representatives of business and civil society, and media personnel from Egypt participated in the program.



Nepal Stall at Food Africa Expo 2025



Ambassador Sushil K Lamsal inaugurated the Nepal Stall at the Food Africa Expo 2025, which kicked off in Cairo on December 9, 2025.

The Nepal Stall showcased various Nepali products, including honey (chiuri honey (butter tree), mustard honey, and wild/rock/mad honey), Himalayan tea, and cereal-based food products. The products on display were from several Nepali agri-food business companies, including Hilife Agro and Foods Industries Limited, Himalayan Chiuri Oil Pvt. Ltd., Himalayan Orthodox Tea Producers Co-operative (HIMCOOP), Gorkha Tea Estate Pvt Ltd., Sundarpani Multi Cooperative Tea Estate, and CG Foods.

Alongside, potential stakeholders and buyers interested in Nepali products were profiled with a view to fostering concrete business and trade linkages.

Speaking on the occasion, Ambassador Lamsal said that the participation of Nepali companies in the expo provided a unique opportunity for cooperation between Nepal and Egypt and the broader region in the agriculture and food sectors.

This was the first time for Nepal to be featured in the Expo.



Ambassador Speaks about Nepal on Radio Cairo



In an interview with Radio Cairo in December 2025, the Ambassador of Nepal to Egypt, H.E. Mr. Sushil K. Lamsal, described Nepal as a country of extraordinary diversity, profound spirituality, and social harmony.
