Bilateral Exchanges

Chief Adviser Congratulates the New Prime Minister of Nepal

On 13 September 2025, Chief Adviser of the Interim Government of Bangladesh H.E. Prof. Dr. Muhammad Yunus sent a congratulatory message to the newly appointed Prime Minister of Nepal Rt. Hon, Sushila Karki.

In his message, the Chief Adviser highlighted the longstanding friendly and neighbourly relationship between Nepal and Bangladesh. He further expressed confidence that under her able leadership and guidance, Nepal and its resilient people would continue to progress on the path of peace, development and stability.

The Chief Adviser also expressed his condolences on the tragic loss of lives during the recent political protests in Nepal.

Prof. Yunus was one of the first foreign heads of government to congratulate Rt. Hon. Prime Minister, following the formation of the interim government in Nepal.

Sri Krishnajanmasthami Reception Hosted by the President of Bangladesh

On 16 August, Ambassador Mr. Bhandari and his spouse Ms. Lalita Silwal attended a special reception hosted by the President of Bangladesh to exchange greetings on the occasion of *Sri Krishnajanmasthami*.

The reception was attended by Religious Affairs Adviser of the Interim Government of Bangladesh AFM Khalid Hossain, Primary and Mass Education Dr. Bidhan Ranjan Roy Poddar, Ambassadors of Nepal and India, and BIMSTEC Secretary General, as well as people of the Hindu community.

Chattogram Hill Tracts Affairs Adviser Visits Nepal

Chattogram Hill Tracts Affairs Adviser of the Government of Bangladesh H.E. Mr. Supradip Chakma visited Nepal to attend the "Hindu Kush Himalaya Parliamentarians' Meet" held in Kathmandu on 18-19 August 2025.

The delegation also consisted of Former Commerce Minister and Standing Committee Member of Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) Mr. Amir Khasru Mahmud Chowdhury, Senior Fellow at the Centre for Policy Dialogue (CPD) Dr. Debapriya Bhattacharya, and Senior Joint Member Secretary of National Citizen Party (NCP) Dr Tasnim Jara.

At the inaugural session, Hon. Adviser highlighted the importance of promoting equitable energy transition policies across the Hindu Kush Himalaya region. He stressed that pollution was not merely an environmental issue, but it also affected the economy, transport, and public health. He further emphasized the need for local adaptation solutions to mitigate the impacts of pollution.

Meeting with Adviser to the Ministry of Power, Energy and Mineral Resources

Ambassador Mr. Bhandari called on Hon. Adviser to the Ministry of Power, Energy and Mineral Resources of Bangladesh H.E. Mr. Muhammad Fouzul Kabir Khan on 7 July 2025. Power Secretary of Bangladesh Ms. Farzana Mamtaz and Chairman of the Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB) Mr. Md. Rezaul Karim were also present in the meeting.

During the meeting, they discussed the progress made thus far in bilateral energy cooperation and deliberated on ongoing project negotiations. The Adviser recalled the commencement of power trade of 40 MW of hydroelectricity between Nepal and Bangladesh through the Indian grid in November 2024 and underscored that it carries a symbolic significance, as it marks the first ever tripartite energy deal in the sub-region.

Ambassador Mr. Bhandari shared with the Adviser the progress of ongoing negotiations on Upper Karnali and Sunkoshi III hydropower projects, emphasizing that both hydropower cooperation held significant mutual benefits for Nepal and Bangladesh.

Ambassador's Meeting with Adviser to the Ministry of Chittagong Hill Tracts Affairs

Ambassador Mr. Bhandari called on Hon. Adviser to the Ministry of Chittagong Hill Tracts Affairs of Bangladesh H.E. Mr. Supradip Chakma on 23 July 2025.

The Ambassador conveyed the condolences and deepest sympathies of the Government of Bangladesh on the tragic jet crash at Milestone School and College in Dhaka on 21 July, which resulted in the loss of lives and properties, including those of young students.

Referring to the Hindu Kush Himalaya (HKH) Regional Parliamentarians' Meet 2025 scheduled to be held in Kathmandu on 18-19 August 2025, Ambassador Bhandari handed over to the Adviser a copy of the invitation letter from the Chair of Agriculture, Cooperatives and Natural Resources Committee of the House of Representatives of the Federal Parliament of Nepal Hon. Ms. Kusum Devi Thapa.

During the meeting, they discussed a wide range of issues of mutual interest including trade, connectivity, energy, and people-to-people contacts between Nepal and Bangladesh.

The Adviser underscored the need for close collaboration between the two countries in areas such as climate change, mountain agenda, sharing of information and data, and disaster preparedness, while also highlighting the importance of strengthening cooperation within regional and subregional frameworks.

Ambassador Meets BNP Leader Mr. Chowdhury

Ambassador Mr. Ghanshyam Bhandari held a luncheon meeting on 14 August with Mr. Amir Khasru Mahmud Chowdhury, former Minister of Commerce and Standing Committee Member of the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP).

The discussions covered a wide range of issues related to Nepal-Bangladesh relations, including

cooperation in trade, energy, tourism, connectivity, and education.

During the meeting, Mr. Choudhury highlighted Nepal's hydropower potential and welcomed the commencement of export from Nepal to Bangladesh, beginning with the 40 MW supply. He expressed keen interest in engaging with stakeholders from Nepal's energy sector during his visit to Nepal to participate in the "Hindu Kush Himalaya Parliamentarians' Meet."

Ambassador's Meeting with Commerce Secretary

Ambassador Mr. Bhandari had a meeting with the Commerce Secretary of Bangladesh Mr. Mahbubur Rahman on 4 September. The discussion focused on ways to enhance cooperation in areas of trade and connectivity.

During the meeting, Ambassador Bhandari emphasized that the bilateral trade volume remained low, with trade imbalance skewed in favour of Bangladesh. While people-to-people ties between the two countries are strong and energy cooperation has seen significant milestones with the commencement of export of 40 MW electricity



from Nepal to Bangladesh, the bilateral cooperation in the fields of trade and commerce has not reached its potential, the Ambassador stressed.

The Commerce Secretary highlighted the possibilities of enhancing garment and pharmaceutical exports from Bangladesh and the import of red lentils and other agricultural products from Nepal and assured the possible support to facilitate trade.

Ambassador's Meeting with NBR Chairman

Ambassador Mr. Bhandari had a meeting with the Chairman of National Board of Revenue (NBR) Mr. Md. Abdur Rahman Khan on 12 August.

During the meeting, the Ambassador pointed out the concerns regarding the imposition of Other Duties and Charges (ODCs), levied on Nepali products in addition to tariffs. He informed the Chairman that Nepali goods are currently subjected to five different types of duties and requested the NBR's intervention to reduce or eliminate the ODCs. The Chairman referred to the excellent relationship between Nepal and Bangladesh and pledged to look into the issue of ODCs.

Ambassador Attends the Unveiling of the 'July Declaration'

On 5 August, Ambassador Mr. Bhandari attended the unveiling of the 'July Declaration' by the Chief

Adviser of the Interim Government of Bangladesh H.E. Prof. Dr. Muhammad Yunus, amidst a public assembly held at the premises of the National Parliament building in Dhaka to commemorate the first anniversary of the 2024 July Mass Uprising that led to the fall of the Awami League government last year.

Addressing the public assembly, the Chief Adviser underscored that the 28-point Declaration would get proper state and constitutional recognition and would feature in the schedule of the "reformed constitution as framed by the government formed through the next national elections".

Leaders from the major political parties, ambassadors and high commissioners, and members of the diplomatic corps based in Dhaka were present at the event.

Economic Diplomacy/Public Diplomacy Programmes

Roundtable Discussion on Bangladesh-Nepal Relations

On 3 August, Ambassador Mr. Bhandari attended a roundtable discussion on 'Bangladesh-Nepal Relations: A Renewed Outlook' organized jointly by the Centre for Policy Dialogue (CPD) and the Nepal Economic Forum, in Dhaka.

Speaking on the occasion, Ambassador Mr. Bhandari highlighted the progress made thus far in Nepal-Bangladesh ties and called for deeper collaboration in sectors such as trade, investment, energy, education, and people-to-people connections. He also shed light on the ongoing initiatives and suggested ways to enhance bilateral economic partnership.

Commending CPD and NEF for their collaboration in fostering dialogue, generating knowledge, and ultimately promoting bilateral cooperation, the Ambassador urged them to continue their research efforts aimed at promoting a robust economic partnership between the two countries.

On 19 September, Ambassador Mr. Bhandari highlighted the resilience of Nepal's tourism industry, stressing that it has always managed to recover swiftly despite various shocks.

On 30 July, Ambassador Mr. Bhandari addressed a seminar on "Harnessing the Youth Dividend" emphasizing the theme 'Harnessing the Youth Dividend: Strategic Imperatives for Nepal-Bangladesh Relations'. The seminar was jointly organized by the Bangladesh Institute of International and Strategic Studies (BIISS) and the Department of Global Studies and Governance at Independent University, Bangladesh (IUB).

Mr. Shakil made history by trekking 1,372 kilometers from the Bay of Bengal (Cox's Bazar) to the summit of Mt. Everest in just 84 days. Meanwhile, Mr. Sherpa achieved a milestone by scaling Mount Everest four times within a span of just 15 days.

The Exhibition was organized by the Bangladesh Mountaineering Trekking Club, from 11 to 13 July 2025 at the Bangladesh National Museum in Dhaka.

Embassy's Other Engagements

The 11th Anniversary of the Establishment of BIMSTEC Secretariat

Ambassador Mr. Bhandari and the Embassy team attended the 11th Anniversary of the Establishment of BIMSTEC Secretariat on 15 September.

On the occasion, BIMSTEC Secretary General Mr. Indra Mani Pandey highlighted the Secretariat's role in facilitating consultation, coordination, and cooperation among member states, aimed at implementing the broad agenda of regional cooperation under BIMSTEC.

Briefing on Bangladesh's Candidature to IMO Council

On 27 August 2025, Deputy Chief of Mission Ms. Lalita Silwal attended a briefing session jointly organized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of Shipping of the Government of Bangladesh. The session was organized to promote Bangladesh's candidature for re-election to the International Maritime Organization (IMO) Council under Category 'C' for the term 2026–27, during the elections to be held at the 34th Regular Session of the IMO Assembly in December 2025 in London.

Speaking at the briefing, Foreign Affairs Adviser H.E. Md. Touhid Hossain highlighted Bangladesh's position as a littoral state of the Bay of Bengal, with strong maritime connections to the Indian Ocean and a rich maritime heritage. Shipping Adviser H.E. Dr. M. Sakhawat Hossain emphasized the strategic importance of the Bay of Bengal as a primary inter-oceanic route connecting the Indian and Pacific Oceans.

Briefing on Bangladesh's UPU Candidature

On 2 September, Deputy Chief of Mission Ms. Silwal attended a briefing held to promote Bangladesh's candidature at Universal Postal Union (UPU). The briefing was jointly organized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Ministry of Posts, Telecommunications and Information Technology.

On 17 August, DCM Ms. Silwal attended a briefing session held in Dhaka on the 'Stakeholders' Dialogue on the Rohingya Crisis' to be organized in Cox's Bazar from 24–26 August 2025. The Dialogue was part of preparations for the international conference on the Rohingya issue, scheduled to be held at the United Nations in New York on 30 September 2025.

National Security Adviser and High Representative of the Chief Adviser on Rohingya Affairs Mr. Khalilur Rahman briefed the Heads of Mission and diplomats on the objectives and structure of the Conference, including multiple high-level sessions. He highlighted that the Conference would provide an opportunity to chart a roadmap for an urgent and lasting solution to the Rohingya issue.

Education/Student Affairs

Meeting with the Vice Chancellor of Bangladesh Medical University

On 4 September, Ambassador Mr. Bhandari had a meeting with Professor Dr. Md. Shahinul Alam, Vice-Chancellor of Bangladesh Medical University (BMU).

The Ambassador congratulated Professor Alam on his appointment and wished him a successful tenure. The Vice-Chancellor expressed satisfaction that a significant number of Nepali medical students form an important part of BMU family.
