His Excellency U Naing Min Kyaw, Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, visited the Embassy of Nepal in Yangon today to sign the book of condolence and convey deepest condolences on behalf of the Government of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar to the Government and people of Nepal on loss of lives and damage of properties following the recent flash flood.

The Ambassador of Nepal to Myanmar Mr. Harishchandra Ghimire and his spouse Dr. Sirjana Bhandari received the Deputy Minister at the Embassy. The Deputy Minister reiterated that the Republic of the Union of Myanmar is always with Nepal in difficult time and has provided the relief aid of \$500,000 along with pulses and beans via charter flight on 02 September. Stating Nepal and Myanmar have been providing support each other in most difficult time, Ambassador Mr. Ghimire appreciated the kind sympathy and support from the Government of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar.

Yesterday Ambassador Ghimire visited Yangon International Airport to see off Myanmar delegation led by Dr. Soe Than, Deputy Minister of Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement of Myanmar to Nepal for handing over relief materials.

On a separate event today, local Nepali community of Myanmar visited the Embassy and expressed their sympathy, solidarity and willingness to donate in the Prime Minister disaster relief fund in Nepal. The Nepali community also organized a Memorial Service event at Ramjanaki Temple in Yangon on 1 September 2026 to express condolence. Ambassador Mr. Harishchandra Ghimire attended the program and delivered his condolence message. Likewise, the President of the All Myanmar Gorkha Hindu Religious Association, Mr. Sagar Ghimire and other community leaders expressed his condolences and sympathies while reiterating the solidarity with the people of Nepal in this difficult time.

The Embassy opened the book of condolence starting from 31 August to 3 September 2026. Ambassadors and representatives of various diplomatic missions and UN agencies based in Yangon as well as well-wishers associated with different private agencies visited embassy to sign the book of condolence and express their sorrow and sympathy.
